Live Streaming Pilot

- During the week of October 5, Orland School District 135 continued its preparation to begin welcoming our students back to school on October 26.
- Our preparation included inviting and welcoming some students into school for an early opportunity to work with their teachers in a new learning environment.
- This opportunity allowed teachers and students to work together in a live streamed environment and provide some of our teachers with an opportunity to interact concurrently with students in-person and remotely.
- This experience was used as part of the professional development shared with teachers throughout the District on October 9.

Professional Development and Support

- Building administrators presented and discussed instructional video highlighting key instructional and technological skills.
- Core technological streaming videos lessons were created and shared with staff during October 9th Professional Learning Day.
- Staff was provided an opportunity to practice/complete lessons in their classroom with the their own equipment.

Professional Development and Support (cont.)

- Teachers encouraged to use/practice technological skills the remainder of full remote instruction. Technology assistance will be provided during this time as needed.
- Instructional strategies supporting live streaming (10/9) and remote teaching are sent weekly (8/20)
- Transitional days on October 22 and 23 will be dedicated to teacher planning and collaboration

Professional Development and Support (cont.)

- Approximately 170 teachers collaborated this summer to adjust scope and sequence for all curriculum, grades Kindergarten - Eight
- The updated curriculum scopes and sequence were shared with staff throughout the month of August with feedback from teachers being included as the school year began
- Science, Social Studies and specials were removed as graded subjects for grades Kindergarten - Five
- Curriculum and assessment was on the agenda during the August Institute Day
- Instructional expectations, strategies, and support were shared throughout August and September

Technology

- Tripled district internet bandwidth (from 1 GB to 3 GB)
- Obtained/delivered iPad stands for all classrooms enabling iPad to be used as document or teacher camera
- Provided teachers two options for microphones. Delivered all requested microphones to teachers prior to Professional Learning Day.

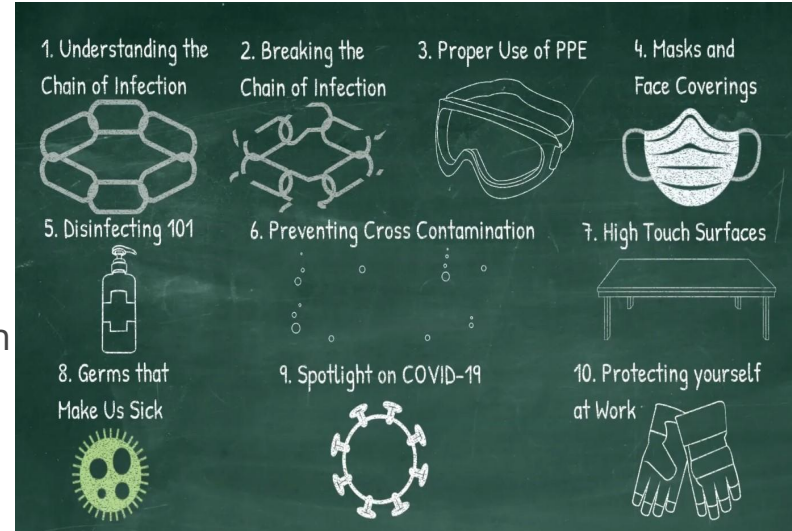

Buildings & Grounds Update

- All schools are being prepared for the return of students including:
 - Moving desks and furniture from building-to-building
 - Tents have been installed for outdoor learning spaces
 - All PPE has been delivered and buildings have hand sanitizer and disinfectant
 - Notices and physical distancing markers are displayed in buildings
- Enhanced Custodial Operations including:
 - Adjusting schedules of custodial staff to provide additional cleaning and disinfecting during the school day
 - All custodial staff will begin an Infection Control Certification Program. This program has been used for custodial staff in healthcare settings and has been modified to specifically address infection control in schools. This program will increase preparation of our staff in mitigating the risk of spreading Covid-19 and other infectious diseases.





STARS Before & After School Program

- 65 children are enrolled in the before and after school program. Enrollments are being taken every day
- With the earlier in-person learning release time, the after school program has been modified as follows:
 - Lunch break (lunch provided by Quest), mask breaks, recess breaks, bathroom breaks
 - Opportunity to participate in pre-recorded specials
 - Opportunity to participate in live, remote instruction for additional support, related services, and social emotional learning (SEL)
 - STARS regular after school schedule including snack breaks, mask/movement breaks (outdoor weather permitting), opportunity for study/homework time, theme activities and free play

Transportation



- 2020-2021 Routing is currently in progress
- Bus Assignments will be released the week of October 19th via email

Cleaning and Safety Plan

- All bus occupants are required to wear a mask
- All bus occupants are required to complete a daily health self-certification
- In compliance with state guidelines, bus capacity will be less than 50
- Enhanced cleaning will be implemented

Health Certification

- Students will receive a health certification postcard in the mail to bring to school on the first day, to be completed by parents
- All students will receive a lanyard and health certification pad to be completed daily by parents
- An updated symptom checklist is posted on the district website
 - *Families will be notified of any health certification changes.*
- Staff use the health certification Google Form daily



Important Message

The current list of symptoms for health certification:

Fever (100.4°F or higher)
New onset of moderate to severe headache
Shortness of breath
New cough
Sore throat
Vomiting
Diarrhea
Abdominal pain from unknown cause
New congestion/runny nose
New loss of sense of taste or smell
Nausea
Fatigue from unknown cause
Muscle or body aches.

*Note: Symptoms you should consider are new onset that are not attributed to allergies or a pre-existing condition.

If you exhibit any of these symptoms, DO NOT REPORT TO SCHOOL/WORK

- Has not traveled internationally within the last 14 days

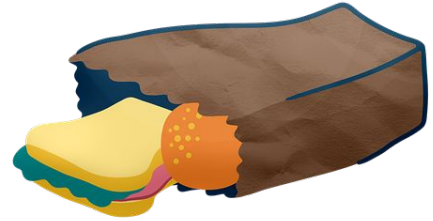
